THE NEED TO CHAMPION EDUCATION IN UTTAR PRADESH AND BIHAR

- Significantly the literacy level in the urban areas in Uttar Pradesh is lowest in India amongst 35 states and Union Territories.
- Further UP's literacy rate amongst females in rural areas is extremely low at 55.6% and in urban areas is 71.7% (ranked 3rd from bottom) after Jammu and Kashmir and Rajasthan
- As per Annual Status of Education Report
 (ASER) 2016, 57% of the STD 5 children in UP and 58% of the STD 5 children in Bihar cannot read STD 2 Hindi textbooks.







JOURNEY SO FAR

- Remarkable Academic Performance
 Independent assessments reveal that children educated through models backed by the E&H Foundation score 100–150% higher marks than their peers in government schools.
- High Attendance Rates
 we have achieved an average attendance rate of approximately 70%, a commendable figure given the vulnerable communities we engage with.
- Serving First Generation Learners
 A significant proportion (at least 80%) of the children we serve, about half of whom are girls, are first generation learners hailing from the most distressed families
- Focus on Impoverished Areas

 Our schools and classes are strategically located in the poorest districts, including slums and basis in urban regions, and remote villages in rural areas
- Cost-Effective Education
 outcomes are achieved at one-third of the
 average cost of government school education

OUR PROGRAMS

- The peer learning initiative involved 85 student leaders, teaching 568 students (294-girls, 274-boys) voluntarily in 2022-23 and 140 student leaders, teaching 738 students (397-girls, 341-boys) voluntarily in 2023-24 fostering community-based education.
- Our Back-to-School Campaign in 50 government schools with the help of school teachers, engaged
 4,500 children through rallies and door-to-door campaigns, successfully reintegrating 650 students back into formal education.
- In partnership with Gyan Shala, we educated around 7,000 students in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, achieving a 70% grade-appropriate learning rate and maintaining a 75% attendance, with a significant enrolment of girls 49% in Uttar Pradesh and 53% in Bihar.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

 We also helped 70 students with Vidhyadhan scholarships enabling them to continue their education without financial constraints.
